

Evans Wadongo shines in meeting with Queen

Kenyan entrepreneur Evans Wadongo has won both the pan-Commonwealth and Africa region Commonwealth Youth Award, receiving more than £5,000 to support his charity Sustainable Development For All (SDFA).

The Commonwealth youth award for excellence in development work was also given to young entrepreneurs from Australia, Barbados and Sri Lanka.

Evans was feted because when he was 19, he designed a solar-powered lantern using recycled materials and is now responsible for making thousands more through his charity.

Though the Queen Mother was unwell during most of the recent Commonwealth festivities, she made time to meet the young developers and congratulate them for their hard work.



"I am just delighted to receive such an honour, considering that it represents development work being done by young people in all 54 Commonwealth countries. It gives me the courage to continue inspiring other young people to see themselves as agents of change in whatever they do," he said to Capital Lifestyle.

"I hope to use the grant to continue with my work and specially to help support shepherd children in Turkana and Samburu get an education," he added.
