As temperatures cool, New York's galleries awaken from their summer slumber to put on a brand-new series of exhibitions. We've rounded up some of the best shows on view right now to help you decide what to see. From Los Angeles-based artist Sarah Cain's monumental painting that sprawls across the concrete floors of Hauser & Wirth's uptown space, to Nendo's cheeky chairs that seem to display emotion at Friedman Benda, to a masterful overview of Sol LeWitt's works at Paula Cooper Gallery, there's certainly something to delight all kinds of art and design lovers in New York today.
